Novena in honour of Our Lady Of Lourdes

The Oblate church in Inchicore invites you to take part in some or all of the Novena that begins on Sunday 2nd and continues until 11th February the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. Each weekday Mass will be celebrated at 10am & 7pm. On Saturday 8th Mass with the Anointing of the Sick takes place at 12 noon (*no 10am Mass*). The concluding three days (Sun, Mon & Tue Bishop Eamonn Walsh will be chief celebrant at 7pm liturgy). This concludes with, weather permitting, a torchlight Procession on Tuesday 11th at 7pm.

Shroud of Turin replicas

St Kevin's church, Kilnamanagh and St Kilian's Kingswood are hosting replicas of the Shroud of Turin. The Shroud of Turin, believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus Christ, bears the image of a crucified man. While its age and origins are debated, it remains a powerful symbol of Christ's sacrificial love. These offer sacred spaces for prayer and reflection. Visitors are welcome to view them during regular opening hours.
