Day of prayer for survivors & victims of abuse

This year's Worldwide Day of Prayer for Survivors and Victims of Sexual Abuse will take place on March 7th, the first Friday of Lent. The Day of Prayer is an initiative of Pope Francis and was first marked in Irish dioceses in 2017. Blessed candles will be lit in parishes across the country as a reminder to the faithful of the need for atonement and to symbolise repentance; light in the darkness and hope. The lighting of the 'Candle of Atonement', and the following prayer, are based on the very moving Penitential Rite composed and prayed by Pope Francis at the final Mass of the 9th World Meeting of Families on August 26, 2018, at Phoenix Park, Dublin, when the Holy Father implored the Lord's mercy for the crimes of abuse and asked for forgiveness.

## **Diocesan Pastoral Council - Update**

We are coming very close to the formation of the Dublin Diocesan Pastoral Council. The five Pastoral Areas have now completed the Fourth Level of Discernment. From the Lord, forgive us our many sins. those who have been hurt by the Church in any way into your loving hands and under the protection of Our Blessed Mother. In the Fourth Level of Discernment this was brought down to 25 candidates. Out of these candidates, nine will be chosen through a Final Discernment.

Towards the end of March the nine candidates will be appointed to the Diocesan Pastoral Council and in Eastertime they will be commissioned in St Mary's Pro-Cathedral.

Alongside the discernment process for the lay members of the Diocesan Council, the Permanent Deacons and Female Religious have been engaged in a process to choose their candidates.
